- Folklore Archives webinars

In 2021 and in reaction to the pandemic we launched a webinar series with SAMLA. 10 webinars (divided to 3 main subjects) are already uploaded to the WG <u>YouTube</u> <u>channel</u>.

Two years ago, SIEF started supporting WG projects. Most funds are used for the WG conferences in between. We used it for the webinars. Another CfA will be published soon, the funding is 800 EU per group. Inclusivity is viewed as an important criterium for this round of project applications. Supporting scholars with no academic position or scholars from impoverished regions is also encouraged.
