- SIEF WG-s should actively encourage young researchers to participate in WG activities. For attracting young scholars, topics regarding contemporary food culture should be more visible in addition to historical food research.

Patricia Lysaght: The 23rd SIEF International Ethnological Food Research Conference Food, People and the City: Comparative Perspectives that was scheduled for 2020 was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and it will take place in Antwerp on 21-23 September 2022. The MAS Museum has good resources for organising the conference. The conference presentations will be the same that were selected for 2020, and new presentations cannot be accepted. More information about the conference will be given by the organisers at the beginning of 2022.

7. Supporting younger food scholars: Professor J.M. van Winter Stipend.

Patricia Lysaght introduced Professor J.M. van Winter Stipend to young scholars doing food research and asks the meeting participants to distribute the information. The deadline for application is on 15 August 2021.

Ester Bardone: Perhaps we should discuss in our WG how young is a young scholar?

Håkan Jönsson: We may take a Swedish example which is often the case in other European countries according to which a young scholar is a person up to 5 years after receiving a Ph.D. degree. It is not related to age, although there might be some exceptions.

Patricia Lysagth: I propose not to elect the new board of the WG today but to make the elections of the new board at the Antwerp conference (the Chair, 2 Co-Chairs, the Secretary).
